THE LATIN AMERICANIST ANNALS ISSUE

Presenters at the March 2023 SECOLAS in Antigua, Guatemala are encouraged to submit their papers for possible publication in *The Latin Americanist Annals* issue. The *Annals* edition is a peer-reviewed, multidisciplinary journal issue published by SECOLAS, the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, Winthrop University, and the University of North Carolina Press.



The Latin Americanist Annals issue publishes scholarly articles from any academic discipline that include original research concerning Latin America. Manuscripts may be in English, Spanish, or Portuguese, and should not exceed 25 double-spaced pages, including notes, tables, and works cited. Authors should include a 150-200 word abstract with their manuscripts.

Papers are chosen for their scholarship, general interest, readability, and interdisciplinary appeal to all Latin Americanists. A manuscript should be submitted electronically to *The Latin Americanist* at this location: <https://latinamericanist.submittable.com/submit>.
