- Neighborhood locals










## Site Profile:

### **Site Analysis:**

The sun moves on a Southern based East-West path. Early morning or Eastern sunlight tends to be lighter in intensity while evening or Western sunlight tends to be harsher in intensity.

### Sunlight Impact:


During the opening hours, the sun will be entering the building from the Eastern wall. The interior of the Entrance wall will have the most intense sunlight at this time.

During the Mid-Day period, the roof will provide some protection on the East and West walls of the building but will do little for the south wall. The second floor of the south wall will receive the most intense sunlight at this time.

During the afternoon and evening the sun will be primarily entering the building from the Western wall. This will leave the eastern interior of the building with the most intense sunlight at this time.


The Northern side of the building will receive the least amount of light, its greatest intensity will be during the midday period.







# Design Problem Statement:


- Create flow between the retail and lounge componentsCreate a defined

- Maximize the role of natural light within the space


























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
