SITE RESEARCH

East Carolina's Millennium Campus / East Carolina Research and Innovation Campus (ECRIC)

- Located in Greenville's warehouse district
- Usage: Collaborations between the university and private companies, commercialize research discoveries, and offer advanced training
- Initial focus on 'Haynie Building' renovations, previously an Export Tobacco Leaf factory built in 1914
- Fronts 10th Street, three blocks from campus
- 22.3 acre site, seven block area
- Purchased in 2003
- Includes Export Tobacco Leaf factory, American Tobacco Co. Storage Warehouse No. 2 (early 1900s), and the Prichard-Hughes Warehouse (1905)
- All three buildings listed on National Register of Historic Places
- ECU received NC Historic Mill Rehabilitation Tax Credit for renovations, saving upwards of 40% of total renovation costs
- Anchor institutions join with education, industry, government, military, and more to discover, invent, and produce new innovations
- Create new jobs and opportunities for the community
- Pharmaceuticals, health care, and engineering will come together here
- Grant of \$1.75 Million from Golden LEAF foundation
- Potential for additional parking areas

THE "THIRD" PLACE

- 'Third' place refers to places where people spend their time between home ('first' place) and work ('second' place)

- Popular among politicians in Europe

Bars and Pubs



- Pubs can be traced back to Roman taverns in Britain and Anglo-Saxon alehouses
- Pubs and bars as we know them today were first seen in the early 19th century
- Places where anyone can go to chat or share stories/ides/etc.

Tearooms (



- Tea rooms were part of the growing opportunities for women in the Victorian era
- Typically owned by women
- Pubs/taverns/hotels/bars were male-dominated industries, tearooms were the answer


