

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
Full Floor Plan

*Camera zooms in on Pat and Fran Gordon's house. Their kids, Dana and Dale, visit for the holiday to see their moms' newly decorated house.

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
Perspectives: Foyer

Perspectives: Kitchen




*Fran looks up from the island to see Pat talking to her son Dale in the living room.

Perspectives: Dana and Dale's Room





FRAN: Dana, Dale! Time for lunch!






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

Historical Precedent

Jugendstil

- · Germany mid 1890s- 1914
- · Artists rebelled against the way of Classic Art
- Replaced exuberance and naturalism of French and Belgian design with restrained and abstracted aesthetic
- Derived from Munich magazine Die Jugend (youth) which featured Art Nouveau designs
- · Growing interest in industrial design and applied arts
- Styles in architecture, sculpture, paintings, and applied and decorative arts

- Use of wood
- Curvilinear furniture
- · Archway in foyer curved
- · Dcors to sun room have botanical design



Historical Precedent

- · Floral style sentimental and naturalistic
- Flowing curvilinear elements that were simplified and controlled creating and organic, ornamental, modernist style
- Asymmetric
- Dreamlike and exotic forms with symbols of sexuality, death, and resurrection
- Legacy: Atmosphere of experimentation and desire for a synthesis of fine and applied arts
