


# **CLIENT PROFILE**


- The client is the developer

  - Individual units- Large kitchens, big windows, great rooms, gathering space/space for entertaining, outdoor space (patio, deck, etc.)







Modern Layout – Open floor plan & clean lines.


Plant life will add movement, shape and color in this space.

Gardening Benefits- Alleviating stress, increase serotonin levels, boots immune system & lowers the risk of dementia.








# Will cover most walls in condo
