History


- Founded in 1771, originally named Martinborough after Josiah Martin, the Royal Governor
- In 1786, the name was changed to Greensville and later shortened to Greenville, in honor of Nathanael Greene
- Greenville is a known industrial, pharmaceutical, and economic contributor to eastern North Carolina
- The city has a population of more than 90,000 people
- It is located 85 miles east of Raleigh and 90 miles west of the Atlantic Ocean

Uptown Greenville

- There are numerous properties in the area placed on the National Register of Historic Places
- This area is particularly popular for its nightlife and sets the stage for pre-game celebrations for the East Carolina football team
- Buildings in downtown Greenville are composed of spaces for boutiques, cafes, government sites, and businesses
- Downtown is located within a 5-minute walk of the 3rd largest university in NC, known as East Carolina University
- Downtown Greenville hosts many events to get the community involved such as the annual Food truck Festival, Greenville Gives, and one of the most popular celebrations—Freeboot Fridays





Site Profile

- 10-minute walk from East Carolina University's central campus










Site Analysis

Problem Statement





Problems seen throughout the building:

- Social Distancing throughout the showroom
 - Using one-way flow of traffic with floor arrows
 - Creating 6-foot distances with furniture section layouts
 - Have creative spaces with moveable furniture that allows desired distance
- Limited natural lighting from front of house window placement
 - Using an array of different artificial lighting such as recessed lighting, accent lighting, and pendant lighting throughout the space
- Limited area for both productive workspaces and furniture showcasing for Teknion and Studio TK
 - Furnish all areas with Studio TK and Teknion furniture to combine productivity with showcasing the product
