- While being especially beneficial for senior living, the accommodations for this complex can also be beneficial to anyone who has a disability or needs some form of assisted living.








# Space Standards


- · Líving room: 400 sq. ft.
  - \* Great area for having family or friends over and large enough to comfortably seat everyone.
- · Foyer: 20 sq. ft.
  - \* Room for a coatrack, small side table, and key holder.
- · Master Bedroom: 400 sq. ft.
  - \* Large enough for the resident to move around and not feel crammed or crowded.
- · Master Bathroom: 225 sq. ft.
  - \* Large enough for accessibility compliant fixtures, including showers and bathtubs.
- · Closet: 150 sq. ft.
  - \* Can store more than just clothes, has room for general storage.
- · Laundry room: 35 sq. ft.
  - \* Large enough for the resident to walk into and have plenty of space to put down laundry baskets without having to bend down.

# Space Standards


- Kitchen: 300 sq. ft.
  - \* Large kitchen with accessible fixtures and space for easy movement.
- · Díning room: 150 sq. ft.
  - \* Space that can be utilized by just the resident or by guests as well.
- · Laundry room: 35 sq. ft.
  - \* Large enough for the resident to walk into and have plenty of space to put down laundry baskets without having to bend down.
- · Guest Bathroom: 100 sq. ft.
  - \* Full bath that can be used by any guest without having to use the accessibility master bath.
- · Guest Bedroom: 250 sq. ft.
  - Perfect size for family or friends to stay overnight, or for a nurse or in-home aid.


