

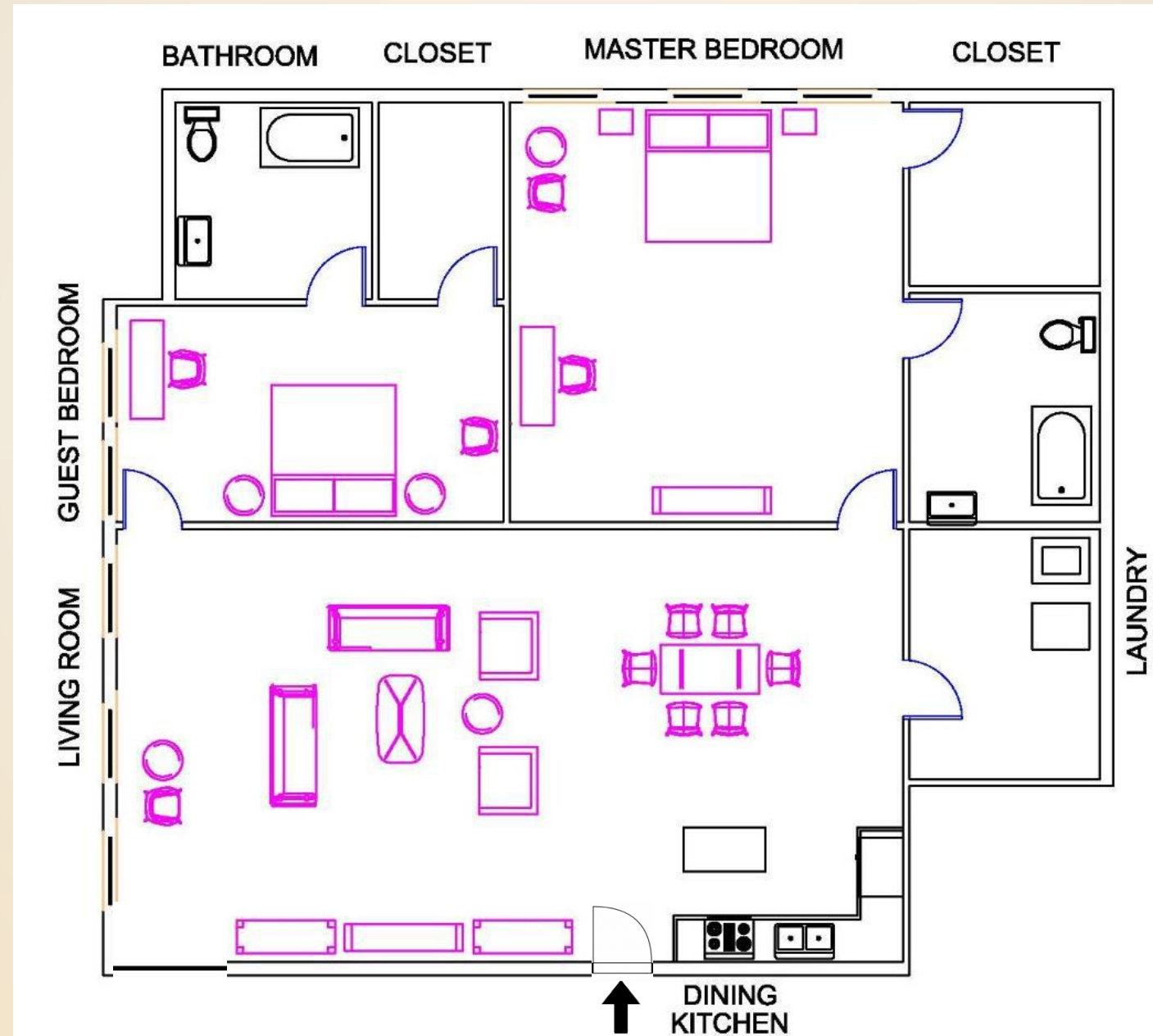

- Two children: Dale, in Pittsburg. Dana, in NC, visits parents a lot. Amputated leg.

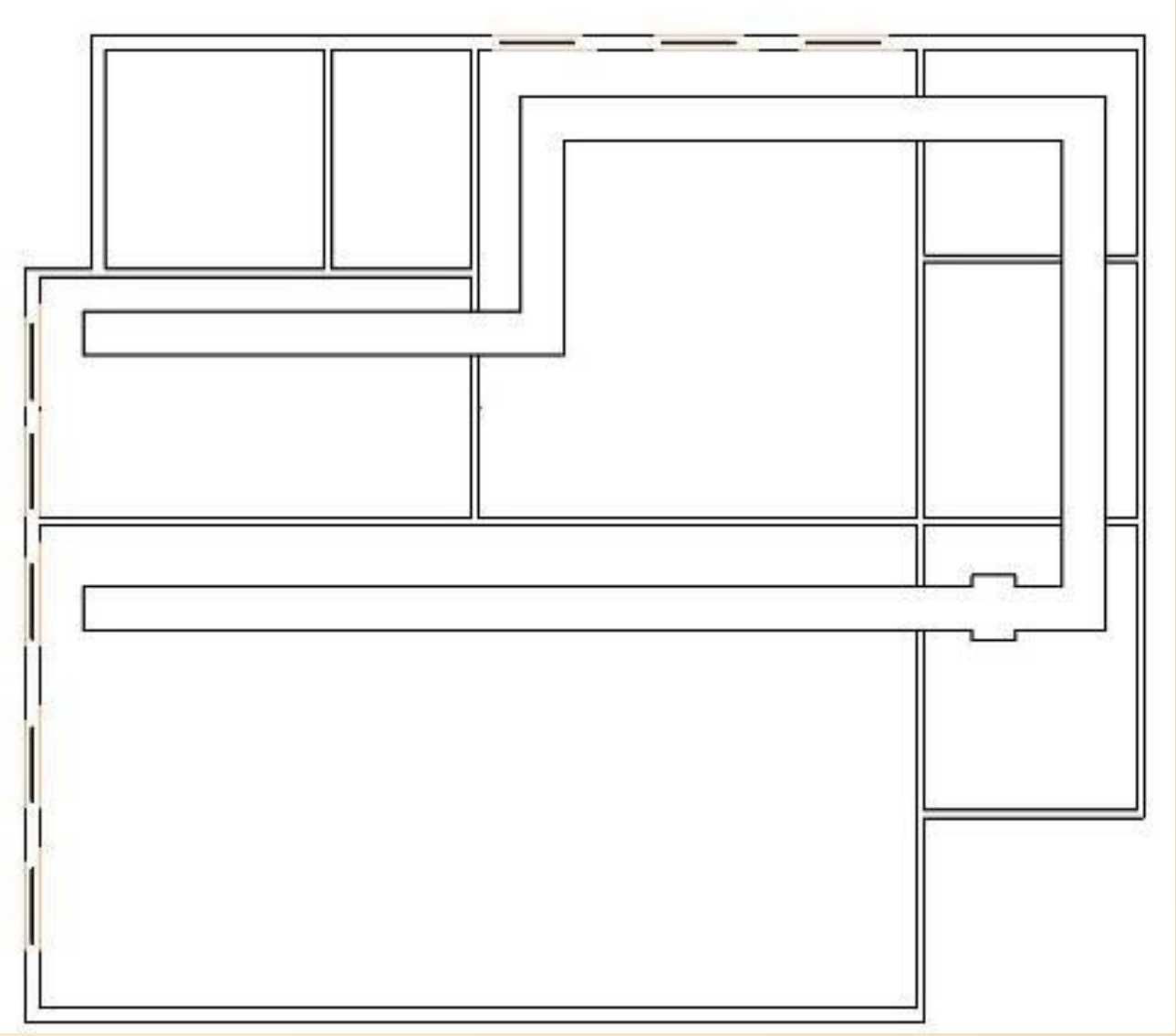
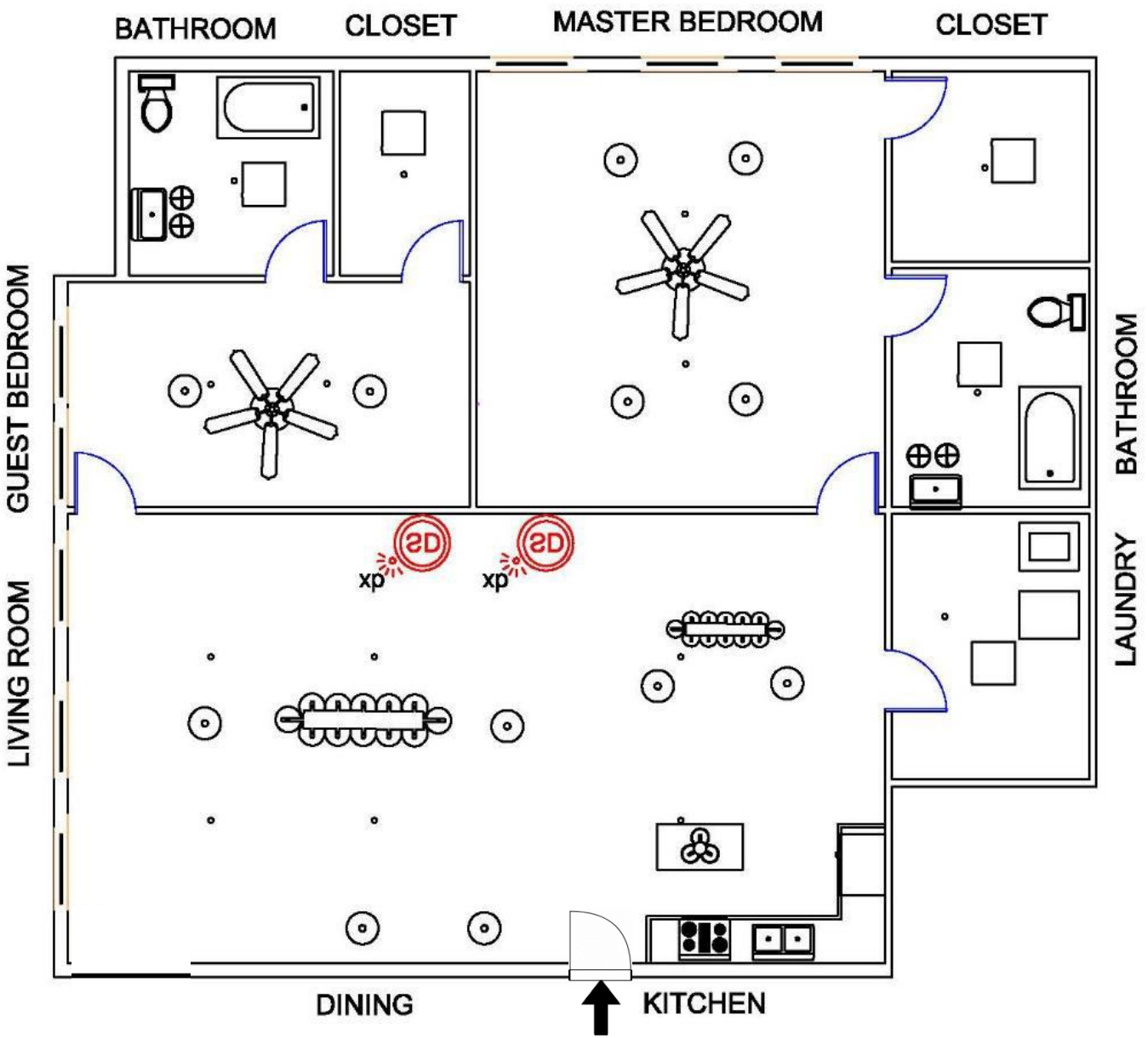

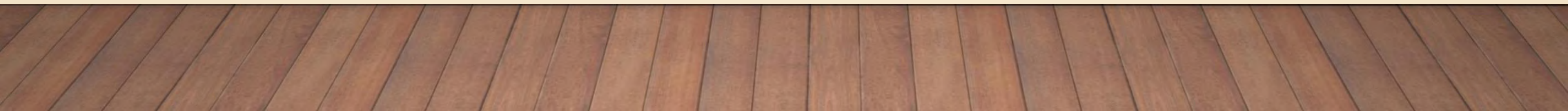
REFLECTED CEILING PLANS

COLOR RATIONALE

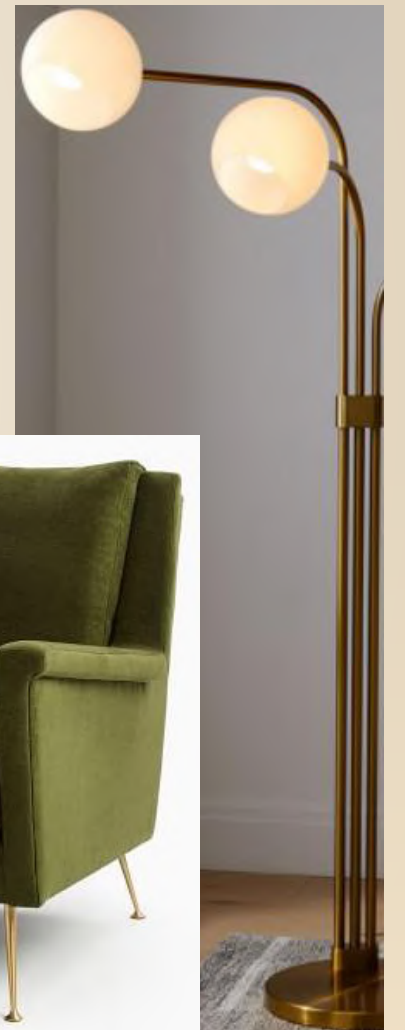
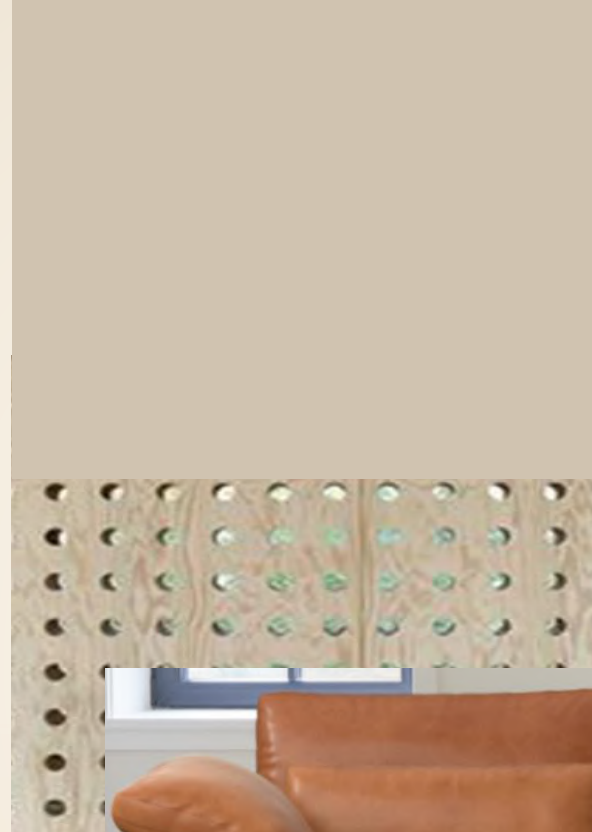
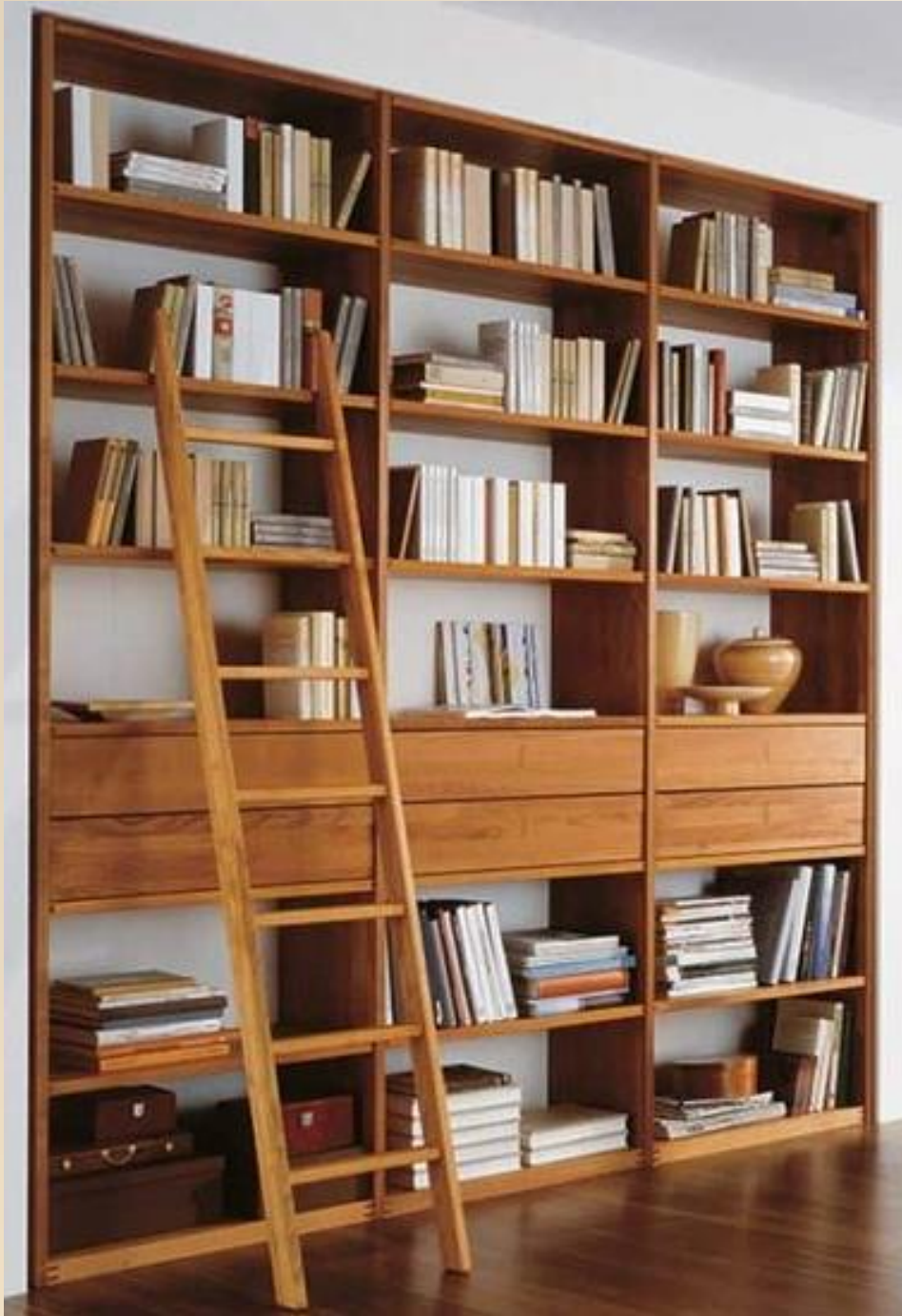
- Can't Stop, Won't Stop

- Greys, beiges, and whites will be the utilized to neutralize the space and allow for balance.



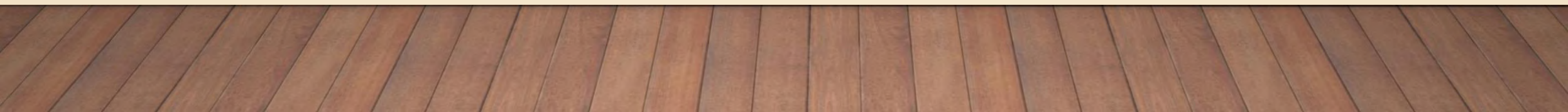
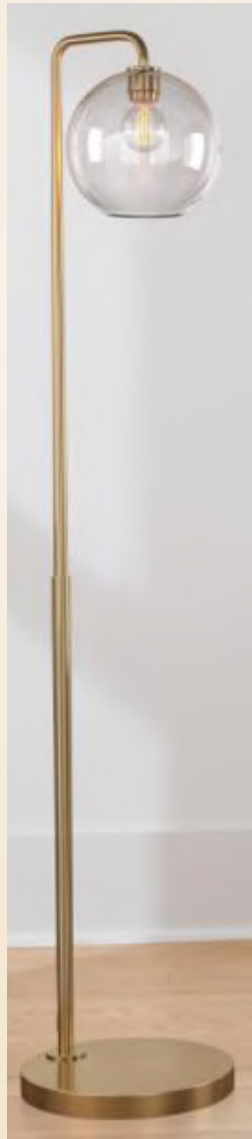

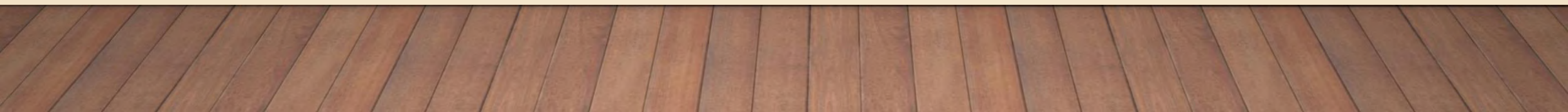
