

Its derivation is from the organic forms in nature and can arguably be a rebellion against the traditional styles typically practiced






My clients, Pat and Fran, have requested their recently purchased condo in the new Senior Living community here in Greenville to reflect an Art Nouveau interior. In the conceptual phase I considered principles/ elements of design and proxemics.



Theories of Human Behavior

Proxemics: the study of the degree of spatial separation that people maintain, while interacting, and how these distances and are related to social, environmental and cultural factors.

Explained from closest to furthest: intimate, personal, social, and public.



Principles:

- Balance: Interiors are very balanced due to the weight, color and shapes used
- Rhythm: Almost everything will have a pattern or subtle detail that adds drama and interest to the space





- Emphasis: The large iron wrought partitions are dramatic attractions to the kitchen and bonus room
- Unity: The organic forms in every room (primarily used in furnishings) brings the space together


Elements

- Lines: Almost always dramatically curved in abstract forms
- Color: These contrasting colors between crisp walls bright walls and dark tones adds to this organic design style






- Mass: The darker tones of wood (indicative of Art Nouveau) add weight, bringing the room in
- Texture: The brassy partition adds a somewhat reflective surface to the space, creating a focal point





























Anthropometric Design allows us to produce furniture that is most comfortably proportional with the human body. This enhances posture support and blood circulation throughout the body.














Rocking Chair Final Product

Seat Back is 20" high to maximize shoulder support and 18.2" wide to allow for comfortable range of motion for this rocking chair

The arm rest sits 9.4" parallel to the seat and concaves in slightly at a 5 degree angle. Both of these features allows the user to have their shoulders and upper back supported. This also discourages slouching.

The seat is 19" wide to allow for both arm rests to be in a reasonable reach length while also allowing the user to be comfortable in the seat.

The detail found in this piece of furniture is specific to Art Nouveau.
